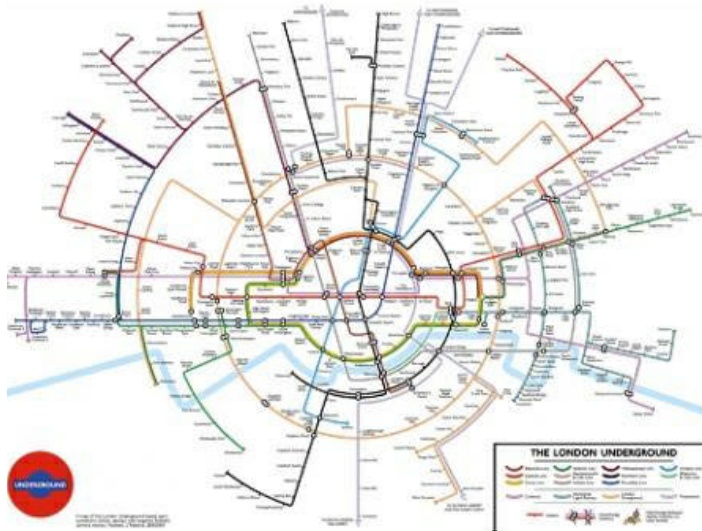


### FOOD WASTE BAGS

As mentioned in the last newsletter cornstarch bags are now available for your brown food scraps caddy and large brown bins. A great alternative to using old newspapers. They can be bought from Parish Council Offices and other places. The Hardware store at the beginning of Baldwins Lane (near the Harvester) is selling them at £2.50 for a roll of 52 bags which should last a year if you use one a week.

### The Croxley Rail Link

A decision on whether the Croxley Rail Link can go ahead may be several months away but the proposed extension has already found its way onto a new tube map. The unofficial circular design, produced by London Underground map expert Dr Max Roberts, shows the extension of the Metropolitan Line to Watford Junction. Two new stations along the route are also pictured on the line which then links to Watford High Street before terminating at the mainline rail station. Also a Watford-based company has clinched the contract to design the £118 million Croxley Rail Link scheme. Taylor Woodrow, which has offices in Clarendon Road, will draw up the engineering plans to route the Metropolitan Line from Croxley station through to Watford Junction. The project will involve building a new viaduct over the A412 and Grand Union Canal and is scheduled to begin in 2014.

The rail link will see two new Metropolitan Line stations created in Ascot Road and Vicarage Road after which will head through Watford High Street Station and terminate in Watford Junction. The inspector's finished report will be submitted to Patrick McLoughlin, Secretary of State for Transport, whose decision is expected soon.



Well when we last left Watford in February, we were third in the table. The next trip was up to Birmingham, for whom it was Troy Deeny's boyhood team. Deeny scored two out of the four in the 4-0 win. With his nifty footwork, he scored twice and Watford became 2-1 winners. Unfortunately we then went on a bit of a poor run which for some reason I cannot remember what happened in those three games. Sorry, should be unbiased, just had my memory jogged. Went to Blackpool and lost 2-1 with Mr Holloway again having a rant on the loan and transfer system but I'll ignore that, and then off to Barnsley where we again lost 1-0. Automatic promotion hopes seem to be fading. One little bit of good news, Matej Vydra won Championship player of the year so congratulations to him. Next we entertained Burnley back at the Vic with the return visit of Sean Dyche who received a warm welcome back from the home crowd. This game turned into a thriller. Watford went one down after 41 one seconds! However, Watford then realised the whistle had been for the start of game and after five minutes equalised from a goal by Deeny. Burnley not accepting that pushed forward and kept the pressure on which resulted in a goal to go 2-1 up. Again, five minutes later Forestieri pulled one back to make it 2-2. Then, with all the excitement of cheering them on, Forestieri added another – 3-2 to Watford. Come on you 'Orns! Into added time and three minutes in, Burnley score again to give a final score of 3-3. Up North we go again to Hull who are just above us in the table. Deeny scored with a cracking shot from

outside the box which landed in the Tigers top right hand corner and that's how it finished. Only one point behind Hull now. Malky MacKay returned with the Bluebird which ended up 0-0. Off to Posh and hopefully get some points there but low in the table Peterborough have got the habit of beating all the top sides of the division and this game was no exception. Watford were 3-0 down and down to ten men as Cassetti was sent off but a quick rally got the score back to 3-2 and then Millwall away but we lost 1-0, luckily other results were going our way. Next Blackburn at home and the Horns trounced them 4-0. A great result and boosted the goal difference. The Foxes away next and they were looking for a win against Watford. Watford won 2-1 with a superb goal scored by Chalobah with a shot that almost broke the net. Leeds at home and this was one game we had to win come what may for an automatic promotion place. The ups and downs of the game was an emotional rollercoaster. Hulls v Swansea see-sawing while at the Vic, we lost 2-1, Deeny sent off and Hulls draw let them scrape the second automatic promotion place. Oh well, typical Watford, do it the hard way. We were drawn against Leicester and without Deeny, due to his red card. Away we lost 1-0 due to Nugent (yet again) putting the Foxes ahead of the two headed game. No worries, only "half time". At home for the second leg in front of the cameras, the game swinging from end to end and it reaches a point of 2-1 to Watford with the aggregate score of 2-2. The Vic is rocking and minutes of time to go and Leicester get a penalty! Keeping the impartial view, Almunia saves it, oh dear, what a pity, never mind. But wait, Watford are running up the pitch the ball is crossed a couple of times and yes, Deeny pokes it in with one minute of added time to go. Yes, yes, yes - Yooou 'Orns, we're going to Wembley to the Play Off Final - Oh yes! For those who read my inane babble at the start of this season and, along with the wife, thought I was on another planet when I said we can but dream, believe me, there are now a lot more Hornet fans on another planet! Hopefully Watford will be in the Premiership next season but whatever happens, the fans cannot really complain thanks to Mr Zola. Have a good Summer everyone.

The Starlight Walk has raised over £1 million since it first started and that money plays a vital part in helping the Peace Hospice keep on running. We are hoping to raise over £180,000 on Starlight Walk 2013. The Peace Hospice cares for over 1,500 people with a life limiting illness from across South West Hertfordshire every year; all the care that the Hospice provides is free.

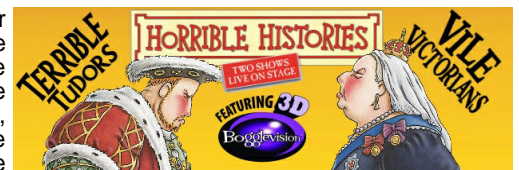

I'm very grateful for all the support everyone gave to the Sea Cadets "Round the World Row" (18-21 April), as part of the fundraising to buy a replacement for our Sail Training Ship, Royalist. She's over 40 years old, and is near the end of her life having given around 9000 young Sea Cadets a great experience of being at sea under sail. The Corps has to raise about £250k to "unlock" around £6m of grants, and this "Rowathon" was a major part of that effort. The idea was to row a total of 24,900 miles, the circumference of the globe, in 80 hours. It was to be done on water and on rowing machines, by Cadets, volunteers, staff and a great range of other well wishers and supporters; and to raise a sizeable amount towards the Appeal. In the Rickmansworth and Watford Unit we set off to make our contribution, as did about half of all the Units in the country and overseas. I planned to row 6 miles, with the Unit doing a total of 100 miles, to raise at least £200. Well, the outcome was that the Sea Cadets Corps rowed 26,815 miles, and (with the funds still coming in) will have raised a very significant amount of the total. In the Rickmansworth and Watford Unit, we raced past our 100 miles on the way to a final total of 265 miles, with some of the Cadets in particular setting remarkable totals (and times). My own contribution, inspired by that, was 7 miles (evidence of effort attached)! Redgrave and Pinsent it ain't, but we got there. We're still collecting in the sponsorship, but it's well past halfway to our £1000 target. So: thank you, very much indeed, for your interest and support to this very good cause, very much "once in a lifetime". ## Neighbourhood Watch

### DIAL 101 FOR SUSPICIOUS INCIDENTS

PLEASE PLEASE PLEASE if you notice a suspicious incident then simply dial 101 from a landline or mobile phone. The call will only cost you 15 pence to make. 101 IS A NON EMERGENCY number that has specially been set up to report any suspicious incident. Residents are encouraged to do this as your call will go to through to a 24 hour call handler who then will be able to despatch the nearest officer in the locality to attend. There are no dedicated officers at police stations who sit at their desk to answer phone calls. It is vital that residents use 101 to report a live incident. We do take a proactive approach to policing in Rickmansworth and would rather catch a criminal or challenge someone at the time than have a crime reported to us later that we could have prevented. If the nature of the incident does not warrant any Police response then please continue to email us your queries or concerns. 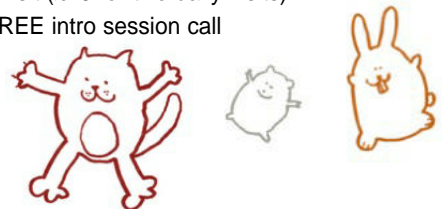

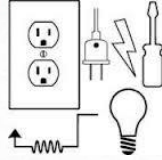

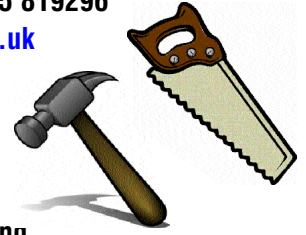
