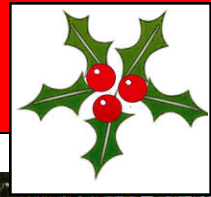
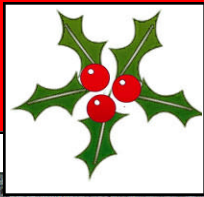

The Armistice – 11th November 1918 Remembrance Day

Last month we commemorated The Armistice, over 90 years since World War I ended but it was only in 2010 when £60 million, the last of the reparation payments, were finally made (required under the terms of the Treaty of Versailles). World War I was supposed to be the 'war to end all wars' and it nearly was! The First World War was in its last days and hours, millions of soldiers on both sides had died. September 1918, on the French battlefield of Marcoing, English Private Henry Tandey (Duke of Wellington's Regiment) won the Victoria Cross for bravery, one of many medals he won. The battle of Marcoing raged, Allied and German forces engaged in hand to hand combat. The crucial moment for world history and Private Tandey came when a wounded German soldier limped directly into his line of fire. He later said that he took aim but could not shoot a wounded man. The German soldier acknowledged his thanks with a wave to Tandey, he was an Austrian Corporal named Adolf Hitler. It seems Hitler never forgot that

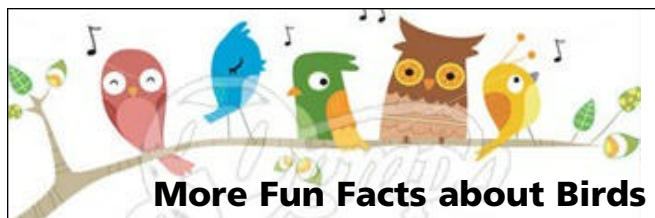
moment or the man who had spared him. It is said that when he became German Chancellor in 1933, he ordered his staff to track down Tandey's service records, which were impressive. Hitler managed to obtain a print of an Italian painting showing Tandey carrying a wounded Allied soldier on his back; this was on the wall of his mountain retreat, Berchtesgaden. British Prime Minister Neville Chamberlain on his historic visit in 1938 was shown the painting and told why Tandey, a British War Hero was so important to Hitler. Chamberlain was asked to convey Hitler's gratitude to Tandey. Chamberlain returned to England, waving a document and stating he had achieved 'peace in our time' after that fateful trip. Henry Tandey lived in Coventry during World War II and saw the devastation from Hitler's bombers and also knew that London was being Blitzed day and night. Henry would often say he wished he had not let that Austrian Corporal live, so many lives could have been saved, and World War I might have been the 'war to end all wars', but fate took over! Henry Tandey died in 1977 aged 86.



Summer break all over and after the highs of the Bournemouth game, off to Reading for a 3-3 draw following a late equaliser by Fabbrini. The 'Orns then entertained Forest, which ended in a draw at 1-1, with Watford coming back from one behind. First cup game - Capital One Cup - of the season against Bournemouth in which the

Derby came to The Vic next in a hard fought contest with both sides taking it in turns at scoring but Derby rammed home their third one and unfortunately, Watford lost 3-2 but even so, both sets of fans were left puzzling over inconsistencies of refereeing decisions. Won't be long before Watford team start getting booked for wearing a yellow shirt! Away to Brighton in which we "drew" 1-1 but should have been 2-1 to Watford as the ball was over the line - The advert with "Karen I have a cat with no pulse here" springs to mind! Then came the "return" match at home against Leicester from the time Watford dumped them spectacularly out of last seasons play offs. Even Harry the Hornet did his version of the build-up to the Deeny goal! Anyway, it was not going to be Watfords afternoon especially after Almunia cleared the ball against a Leicester player and we all watched the rebound sail quite nicely in to the Watford net. And yes, we lost 3-0. Moving on, other results in the league went our way and we held seventh position in the table. Off to Middlesborough and after being one down the Golden Boys took the lead for 2-1 but in the last few seconds of injury time, Middlesborough pulled it back to 2-2. Mind you, we still held on to seventh place... just. Merry Christmas every one.

1. *Woodpeckers* can peck twenty times a second.

4. The fastest bird is the *Spine-tailed Swift*, clocked at speeds of up to 220 miles per hour.
5. A *Seagull* can drink salt water because it has special glands that filter out the salt.
6. A *Duck's* quack doesn't echo anywhere, and no one knows why.
7. The now-extinct *Elephant Bird* of Madagascar laid an egg that weighed 12 kilograms.
8. Air sacs may make up 1/5 of the body volume of a bird.
9. Birds don't sweat.
10. A bird's heart beats 400 times per minute while resting and up to 1000 beats per minute while flying.
11. The only known poisonous bird in the world is the *Hooded Pitohui* of Papua, New Guinea. The poison is found in its skin and feathers.
12. The *Common Loon* can dive more than 76 metres below the water's surface.
13. A *Malleefowl* lays eggs in a nest full of rotting vegetation. The decay gives off heat to keep the eggs warm; the male bird checks the temperature often and adjusts the pile as necessary.
14. Male *Weaver* birds spend the majority of their lives building nests to impress females. However, if the female is not immediately impressed by his handiwork, the male takes offense and chases the potential mate off.
15. The stunning scarlet *Macaw* eats clay from riverside deposits, which may help it process toxic seeds it consumes.
16. A male *Sand Grouse* soaks himself in water, then flies back to the nest so his chicks can drink from his feathers.
17. *Mockingbirds* can imitate sounds of other birds.



CROXFEST FESTIVAL ON THE GREEN 2013




Thousands flocked to the "terrific" Croxfest, where visitors gathered to hear the free music on offer. A total of 10 acts performed throughout the day at the event on The Green, which started at midday and finished at 8 pm. Croxfest 2013 received wonderful comments from those who attended, the overwhelming feedback was that everyone enjoyed themselves and had a terrific time. The support was tremendous, and people are already showing interest for 2014. This is a free event, but there were donations from those who attended for various local charities and some of the funds went towards covering the cost of the event. Last year's event attracted between 5,500 and 6,000 people, but this year it is believed that the third Croxfest had between 7,000 and 8,000 visitors, support definitely seems to be growing. There was a variety of music, which ranged from original material to well-known sing-along covers. There were a number of stalls selling food, snacks and beverages. While no alcohol was allowed to be sold on the festival site, visitors were allowed to bring their own with a picnic. 9. Jesus was probably born in a cave and not a wooden stable, say Biblical scholars.
10. The abbreviation Xmas isn't irreligious. The letter X is a Greek abbreviation for Christ.
11. The world's tallest Xmas tree at 221ft high was erected in a Washington shopping mall in 1950.
12. The chances of a white Christmas are just 1 in 10 for England & Wales, and 1 in 6 for Scotland & Northern Ireland.

FOOD WASTE BAGS

As previously mentioned cornstarch bags are available for your brown food scraps caddie and large brown bins. A great alternative to using old newspapers. Hertfordshire Police would like to warn residents to be mindful of door-to-door salesmen that report to be ex-convicts attempting to mend their ways. If any sales person comes to your door, we would suggest you ask to see their 'Pedlar's certificate' - these are only issued to individuals under very strict conditions. 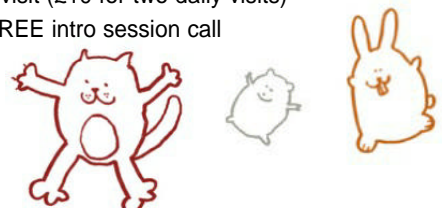
