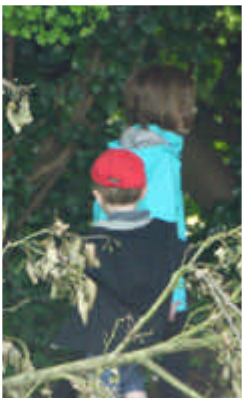

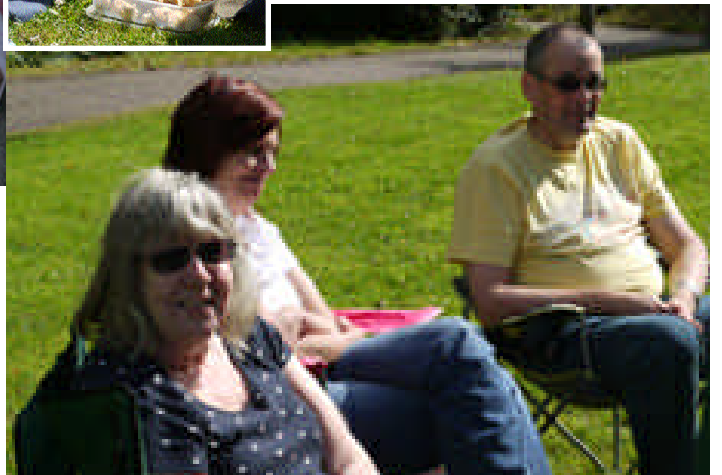

WATERCRESS AND HERTFORDSHIRE

E. Tyler & Sons growers of watercress have been in Moor Lane in Sarratt Village since 1886 and are thought to be the last watercress growers left in Hertfordshire. Parts of Hertfordshire were once famous for watercress growing and it was very

sought after. The busy Rickmansworth goods yard transported hampers of watercress each day to London. The loaded train would make its way alongside Croxley Common Moor. Even Croxley station had watercress growers bringing their bundles for transporting; I believe watercress was being grown very close to Byewaters as well. Sansom of Croxley Hall Farm was another family that had watercress fields around Hertfordshire. This was a pretty big business and watercress was considered full of flavour with a peppery taste and very good for you. It seems that those Victorians were right to praise the leaf, as new research now shows that it is packed with beta-carotene and Vitamin A equivalents, which are great for healthy skin

and eyes, and antioxidants that can help mop up potentially harmful free radicals. Research also shows it is emerging as an important player in the field of cancer prevention. It contains more vitamin C than oranges, more calcium than milk and more iron than spinach, watercress is low in fat, tastes great and is incredibly versatile. If you buy watercress from the supermarket it is probably from America or Portugal and cannot be guaranteed as being chemical free. E. Tyler & Sons grow their product completely chemical free and can be bought fresh, directly from their farm in Sarratt. Unfortunately lately there have been some problems with Thames Water and pollution in the River Chess. But things like this have happened in the past to cause watercress growers problems. An old article I found noted that 'tar' had managed to get into the river and the watercress growers were suing the local councils for loss of earnings as their crops were ruined. This was back when watercress fields were widespread in Hertfordshire. Tylers are still growing but with spring water until the problem in the river is solved by Thames Water. Let us hope the growers of Sarratt can keep cultivating watercress which according to the research has so many excellent properties to keep us healthy.

Black and Green Bins!!

Well it has arrived, yet another wheelie bin this time Black with a Green lid. I did telephone and enquire if there was a smaller size but was told no! All the bins that were ordered are the same size. No consideration obviously was given of where householders are going to put yet another wheelie bin. Some properties have plenty of storage space but others have very little. In principle I suppose it makes things easier placing all recycling into one bin instead of separating it all. It does make you think that if the Council are going to have to sort through the recycling when they get it, why don't they do that with all the rubbish, with the exception of food and garden waste. Then we would be back to just two bins but is that just too simple! What are your thoughts?

Croxley Green residents celebrated at the village's annual mid-summer fair and it was a great success, even the weather was on its best behaviour. The Revels, organised by the

Croxley Green Society and supported by the parish council took place on Saturday, 21st June. The Croxley Revels is one of the biggest free summer village fairs in the area and attracts thousands of people every year. 'Lest We Forget'

We are remembering the Start of the First World War, 4th August 1914 and this war was at the time thought by most to only last a few months. Unfortunately this idea was dreadfully wrong and for the next four terrible years modern warfare showed us all its horrors. Most of my family links to wars are with the 2nd World War with family members in the army and my Dad in the RAF. My great uncle Jacob (known as Johnny) Da Costa went off to the First World War he was in the 51st Battalion Royal Fusiliers and died just before the end of the war on 30th October 1918, he was 19 years old. I do not know exactly what happened to him, he obviously came home as he has a private Memorial Grave. He was buried on 1st November 1918 which makes me think he came home injured or maybe caught Spanish Flu which spread like a wild fire through the ranks. I know his story, a very young man dying at this time was not unusual. It is just that he was so young and the war was almost over such a waste of a life which is echoed through the years to this very day - 'Lest We Forget!' I don't think this means we must not forget just the First World War but we must never forget the horror of all wars! When we gather to remember on this Remembrance Day it will be even more poignant and I recall what is written on his tombstone 'In Memory of JACOB beloved son of Benjamin and Dinah Da Costa who died 30th October 1918 aged 19. Deeply mourned by his sorrowing parents, sisters, brothers and relatives'. What a waste of a young life - no more wars please, let us keep our son's safe.

I found this photograph on the internet of soldiers returning from the First World War. They are on Croxley Green, some are in wheelchairs, two others are on a cart being pulled by a donkey. You can see the church in the background. It looks like a very quiet country road, not as it is today, a very busy road with lots of cars speeding along it. Maybe the soldiers were being cared for locally, do you know if that was the case?



Neighbourhood Watch

Hertfordshire Constabulary is reminding residents that leaving windows or doors open, to keep the home cool during the hot weather, can offer opportunities to criminals. Whilst the number of burglaries has remained low this year, the lure of insecure doors,

windows and out-buildings can encourage opportunistic thieves. There is a great deal that residents can do themselves to reduce the risk of their property and home being targeted: Check that all ground floor windows and doors are closed and locked when you are in the back garden, leave the house or go to bed. Upstairs windows should be closed and locked when the house is unoccupied. uPVC doors can only be properly locked by lifting the handle and using the key. Car and house keys should be kept out of sight. Don't leave them on display on window sills, in porches, hallways or kitchens. If you are away overnight or on holiday, use timer switches indoors to turn lights on and off, giving your home a 'lived-in' look. A good quality alarm and external dusk till dawn low energy lighting, fitted near doors and other entry points, are excellent deterrents. Register your valuables on the free database www.immobilise.com - it is quick and easy to do and can help police return them to you if they are lost or stolen. It also helps police to prove that property found in a suspect's possession is stolen. For comprehensive crime prevention advice visit

Don't let your money go down the drain.

Did you know that the surface water / rain water from the houses on the Byewaters estate is fed into a separate "surface water" main sewer? This is a private / un-adopted sewer which discharges into the river Gade.

Because of this you can claim a "surface water abatement" reduction on your water bill. See "My waste water" at www.affinitywater.co.uk or the back of your water bill for more information. By successfully claiming this "abatement" you should be able to reduce your combined clean water and sewerage bill by up to £25 per year.

NEWS FROM ST. OSWALD'S

We would love to see parishioners at any of our services at 8am or 10am on Sundays. Special occasions in the next few months include Harvest Festival on 5th October. In addition to the regular morning services there will be an extra 6.30pm service of Choral Evensong and we are asking for non-perishable harvest gifts for Watford and Three Rivers Refugee Project and raising money for women's literacy in Egypt through Christian Aid. On Sunday 3rd November at 3pm we have our annual Memorial Service to remember and light candles for loved ones who have died – please let me know any names you would like added to the list. park on the pavements especially all four wheels. Besides baring the way for buggies and wheelchairs, vehicles can damage pavements causing trip hazards, oil leaks can cause slippages. Please keep your speeds down and keep everyone safe, don't be the cause of an accident, always think of others.



FOOD WASTE BAGS

As previously mentioned cornstarch bags are available for your brown food scraps caddie and large brown bins. A great alternative to using old newspapers. They can be bought from Parish Council Offices and other places.

The Hardware store at the beginning of Baldwins Lane (near the Harvester) is selling them at £2.50 for a roll of 52 bags which should last a year if you use one a week.

And now for something completely different – another wheelie bin!

You will have now received your large weekly recycling bin which can take newspapers, magazines, plain cards, telephone directories etc. aerosols, clean foil, plastic containers & bottles, cartons, cardboard, glass bottles and jars. 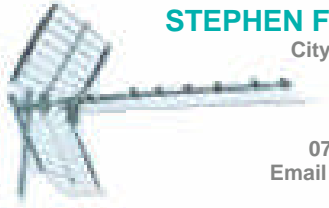

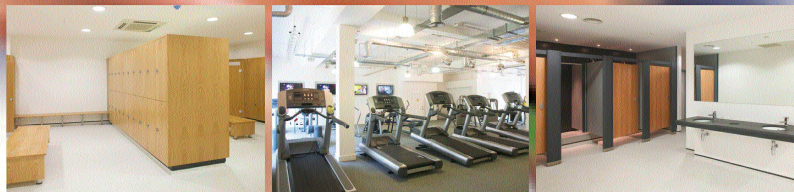
