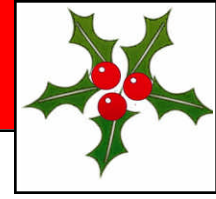
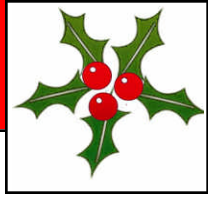

CHOCOLATE RICE KRISPIES WREATHS

This recipe for these lovely chocolate rice Krispies wreaths is so much fun to make with all of the family? Decorate with sprinkles, pretty ribbon and wrap in cellophane to make the perfect gift. You can also drizzle white chocolate over for a snowy effect.

Key Information: Prep: 15 mins, Serves: 4, Skill level: easy
25g (1 oz.) Butter (unsalted). 2tbsp Golden syrup
150g (5 3/8 oz.) Milk chocolate milk or dark, chopped.
100g (3 1/2 oz.) Rice Krispies

The Method

Place the butter and syrup in a small pan and heat gently until the butter has melted.

Add the chocolate and stir until it has melted and the mixture is smooth. Stir in the rice Krispies until well coated in chocolate.

Line a baking tray with baking parchment and place teaspoonful's in a small ring shape onto the paper.



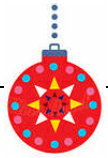
Allow to cool in the fridge for 10 mins. until firm, then finish with edible decorations, add a ribbon tied in a bow. Store in a cake tin for 2 days.

Neighbourhood Watch

Following recent media coverage concerning phone and broadband provider, TalkTalk, who had reported that their customers' information, including credit card, bank account details, names, addresses, dates of birth, email addresses and telephone numbers could have been accessed by hackers in a recent cyber-attack. A number of Hertfordshire residents have reported receiving suspicious contacts from persons purporting to be from TalkTalk. These were likely to be scam attempts. TalkTalk have informed UK police that they will not be phoning customers directly with regard to this incident. If you are contacted by telephone by persons claiming to represent TalkTalk, particularly if you are asked for your password or account details or if they suggest that they can remotely fix a problem or lead you through a process to help you to fix or secure your computer, you should treat such contact as suspicious. If you receive an email purporting to be from TalkTalk, beware that it may be a targeted scam email, known as a "phishing" email. You should not click on any links that have been emailed to you from potentially suspicious sources, as these links could download harmful software onto your computer. TalkTalk have said they will NEVER send you an email asking you to provide your full password, they only ever ask for two digits from it to protect your security. If you are in doubt about any contacts that you receive from anyone claiming to be from TalkTalk, you should contact TalkTalk customer services using the advertised number. Don't be the cause of an accident – 20mph or less !!

Unfortunately in August there was an accident between two vehicles just as you enter Byewaters by the weir. 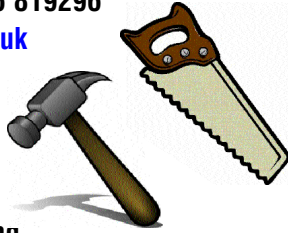

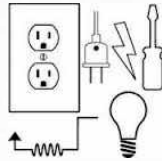

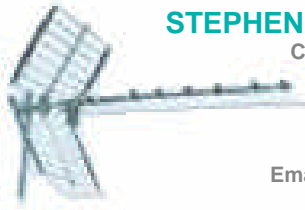
