The Council are now showing so many films they cannot compete for audiences and the use of volunteers. For over 12 years they have proved to the Council that films are wanted and do pay. Cassiobury House was a magnificent stately home with extensive grounds. Building started around 1546 but was remodelled in the 17th century. It was the ancestral seat of the Earls of Essex. The architect Hugh May remodelled the house into an "H" ground plan as he had already done at Windsor Castle. There was an avenue of 296 lime trees in the park land linking the garden to Whippendell Wood, remnants of this can still be seen today. The Dower House, Little Cassiobury still exists to this day in Hempstead Road. The 4th Earl of Essex was on the board of the canal company building the Grand Union Canal. Much later the upper park became the West Herts Golf Course. In 1846 - 1848 the house was the temporary residence of the Dowager Queen Adelaide widow of King William IV. Adelaide's visitors while at the house included Queen Victoria and Prince Albert. Unfortunately due to death duties the 8th Earl of Essex had to put the house up for sale. He and his mother did not find

a buyer and in 1927 the house was demolished. Valuable items from Cassiobury House can still be seen in various museums around the world. (Many pieces can be found in the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York.) More information can be found on the internet.

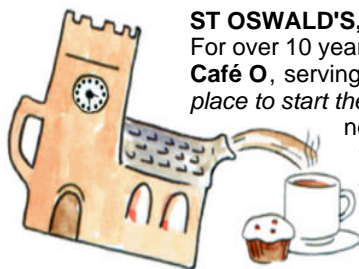


CROXFEST

Keyless Vehicle Theft – Advice for Owners of Keyless Vehicles



Police in Hertfordshire frequently receive reports from people whose "keyless" vehicles have been stolen. If your vehicle uses a vicinity key, please follow the advice below. What is a vicinity key? A vicinity key operates the vehicle to which it belongs using an automatic signal. You only have to be near to the vehicle for it to detect the key is present and unlock. The key (or signal) only has to be present to enable you to press a button to turn on the engine. Keyless theft: how it works - This is where a vehicle is stolen without the thief having physical access to the key. Thieves use a signal boosting device which picks up and boosts the signal detected from your vicinity key to the vehicle, making your vehicle think the key is nearby. Keep vicinity keys in a signal blocking pouch which stops the signal from your key. You can source Police approved 'Secured By Design' signal blocking pouches on the internet. Keep keys away from the front of your property; upstairs and hidden away is preferable. Check your Manual or with your Dealer if it is possible to switch the key's signal off. For additional security, consider purchasing a steering wheel lock. If your vehicle has an alarm or immobiliser, ensure these are enabled. If your vehicle doesn't have a Tracker, consider fitting one. A dual band tracking device works on VHF/UHF and GPS to ensure that one tracking system can still function if criminals use GPS blocking techniques to avoid detection. Purchase devices to 'Thatcham' and 'SBD' approval. Vehicles equipped with tracking devices are often promptly recovered. General Contact Advice: Telephone **999** in an emergency where there is a danger to life or a crime is in progress. Telephone **101** for non-emergencies where Police attendance is required, to report a crime or to report any other incidents. Calls to 101 have a fixed cost of 15p per call.



FOULING – Byewaters is covered by a PSPO!

Unfortunately 11 years on from our first newsletter some people still have not got the message regarding fouling!! It has been brought to my attention that Byewaters has been included in the PSPO for Three Rivers Council. PSPO is a Public Spaces Protection Order and the full order can be viewed on <http://www.threerivers.gov.uk/service/public-space-protection-order-pspo>

Basically this means that owners not removing their dog's faeces on Byewaters can be fined £75 (max fine of £1000). You can report anyone seen not removing dog faeces on Byewaters to Three Rivers Council or contact FixMyStreet <http://www.fixmystreet.com> and they will send a report to Three Rivers. FixMyStreet does cover other matters as well such as dumped items, clearing graffiti, potholes etc. and of course dog fouling. They send your report to the people whose job it is to fix it.

There is an app for iOS and an Android app, Nokia Ovi app. If your phone isn't supported try accessing FixMyStreet via your mobile browser.

Hopefully this can help in the fight to keep our street clean and there is no excuse as biodegradable bags are FREE from the Parish Council Offices and some libraries.

Always think of others and use bags to pick up after your pet and then BIN it preferably in a RED waste bin.



CORN STARCH BAGS

These are available for your silver food scraps bucket and are an alternative to using old newspapers. They can be bought from Parish Council Offices and other places including the hardware store at the beginning of Baldwins Lane (near the Harvester).

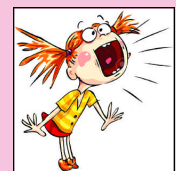

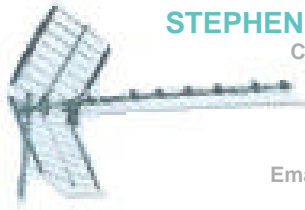

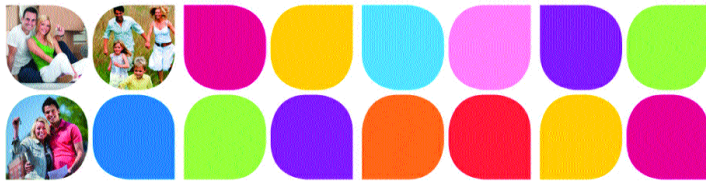
